ALLERJET RECALL

There is a nationwide recall on all ALLERJECT **epinephrine injectors** (small automated device.) Below is the recommendation for parents on how to proceed with getting a replacement injector:

- 1. Phone your pharmacy, let them know you have an Allerject injector
- 2. Bring the Allerject injector back to your pharmacy to get an alternative as a replacement (likely EpiPen)
- 3. Pharmacies are generally only allowing 1 injector (likely EpiPen) for each family in need, as due to this recall, there will be a sharp rise in need for EpiPens, and therefore supply might meet demand

OF NOTE: If a child has an Allerject device, and has an anaphylactic reaction, STILL USE THE DEVICE and call 911. It may still save the child's life. The recall is due to a potential incorrect dose of epinephrine. So again, if they do not have a replacement device yet, and have an anaphylactic reaction, still use the Allerject injector as instructed.

PROVINCIAL ACHIEVEMENT TEST RESULTS

We would like to share the results of Provincial Achievement Test Results from Grades 6, written in May and June of 2015. To provide some background on the tests, Grade 6 students write exams in 4 subjects: Language Arts, Math, Science and Social Studies. The Language Arts test has a writing section in which students view a picture and write a story about the picture and another task in which they review a set of facts and write a newspaper article based on the facts. The reading component has 50 multiple-choice questions on informational text, poetry, finding main ideas and details. Almost equal weighting is given to the reading and writing component in determining a students' mark. The Math test contains 50 multiple-choice and numerical response problem-solving questions. The Science and Social Studies exams each contain 50 multiple-choice questions, covering content from the Grade 6 curriculum, as well as testing students' ability to find, analyze and synthesize information from graphs, diagrams, tables, maps and draw conclusions. In the Social Studies test, students must analyze opinions/statements from different perspectives and answer questions about these varied perspectives. These tests cannot cover an entire year of work and are limited to testing the types of knowledge and skills that can be measured on a multiple-choice test. For this reason, they add to, but do not replace, on-going teacher assessment. Results are useful to us in that, unlike most standardized tests, they are based upon the Alberta curriculum. When we receive the results, our teachers look at item analysis and individual and group results, looking for patterns and trends over time to determine areas of growth and areas of strength.

Gr 6 LA (Writing and Reading) - 98% acceptable; 14.3% Excellence

Gr 6 Science - 94% acceptable; 18.4% Excellence

Gr 6 Math - 84% acceptable; 8.2% Excellence

Gr 6 Social Studies - 86% acceptable; 18.4% Excellence

As you can see from our results this year, our students have once again achieved strong results. Highlights include: 100% of Grade 6 students achieved at the Acceptable Standard in Writing, and over 37% of students achieved the Standard of Excellence in Reading. The Learner Assessment Branch of Alberta Learning provides an information sheet in the fall for each parent of a child who wrote last year's exams. Student results on each of the subtests are given, as well as indicating whether a child achieved at the acceptable standard or at the standard of excellence. This Information Sheet will be sent to the school at which our former Gr 6 students are now attending. If you have any questions regarding Provincial Achievement Exam results, Mrs. Tod or Mr. Hayes would be pleased to help you! You may recall that, in past years, Gr 3 students also wrote PATs. These have been replaced by the SLA - Student Learning Assessment. The SLA has more of a diagnostic purpose and results will be shared by Gr 3 teachers during November Parent-Teacher Interviews.
