MEET 17-YEAR-OLD JONACEL BERJA FROM THE PHILIPPINES



Jonacel has a little brother and two little sisters.

For breakfast, she eats rice and sometimes fish or chicken. She goes to school in a pedicab, a kind of 3-wheel bicycle-taxi. Her favourite subject is math because she loves solving problems.

When she grows up, she wants to be a teacher to help little children learn to read, write and count. After school, she helps her mom do the dishes and clean house, or babysits her sisters.

On November 8th, 2013, her country was hit by the strongest typhoon in its history: Super Typhoon Haiyan. When the typhoon hit her home, she was very scared, and found refuge in a church.

Development and Peace is now working with Urban Poor Associates to help her community recover. When we asked Jonacel if she had a message for children in Canada, she answered: "Like me, go to school every day and help your mother and family in your house."

All 16 schools in Greater St. Albert Catholic Schools are partnering with Development & Peace to help build a school in Tacloban in the Philippines. We have been given the honour of naming the school. The new Pope Francis School will serve students like Jonacel.
