TD Clean and Green RiverFest

This year's TD Clean and Green RiverFest is scheduled for Saturday, May 7, 2016 from 2 - 5 pm (located behind St. Albert Centre). In addition to cleaning up along the river and planting trees, there will be an Environmental Fair, and BBQ care of St. Albert Centre. The TD Clean and Green RiverFest is the annual river clean-up combined with The River Edge Enhancement Project (REEP); a community partnership consisting of community members, BLESS volunteers and City staff who each year work on increasing the amount of animal habitat in the river valley by planting native trees and shrubs along the river's edge. This event is for all ages. It's an opportunity for individuals, groups or families to attend and to learn how everyone can impact his/her environment in a positive way. The environment fair part of the day provides many learning opportunities to this theme.

<u>A NEW ROUTINE FOR SPRING!--ARRIVAL AT</u> <u>SCHOOL</u>

Building independence in children is one of the best ways to alleviate anxiety and allow them to build the skills to become more confident. The level of independence that children can manage certainly differs by age, but it is important for parents to recognize their children's need for independence and support them so they are successful and confident. As parents, we want to model, teach, and gradually step away to allow our children to take over tasks that are manageable for them. The message we give is that we believe they can do it and have faith in them. So, in the morning, we are recommending a quick hug at the school doors or at the bus stop, and then having all of our K-6 students to join their friends at the back of the school, and come into their regular doors and take care of organizing their belongings and getting ready for class on their own. PreK children are still able to be walked in by their parents to wait with them until classes start. Children who are not driven or walked to school do this every day and they do it very well. If there is a slight problem, learning to solve this problem on their own or ask for assistance is also а valuable learning experience. The weather is nice, supervision is provided at 8:10 a.m. everyday, and your children get that all-important 'I know you can do this' message! Plus, you can drop them off in the drop-off zone and have fewer parking hassles!

For afternoon kindergarten classes, please wait for your child at the front door until the teacher brings them to you, instead of around the classroom door. Our 2/3F and 1P classes are still in session and we want to minimize any hallway noise for them.
