Technology - Integral to our planning for 2016-17 is also the opportunity for all children to bring a robust electronic device to enhance their learning (BYORD-Bring Your Own Robust Device). We use the term 'robust' to define a device that contains the features most appropriate for the school learning environment. Just as computers are becoming a 'must have' for many employees, we are finding that having children bring their own 'robust' device and having it available to them on a continual basis opens up many opportunities for collaboration, new ways of accessing information and sharing knowledge. Our school has benefitted tremendously from access to a computer lab, our laptop cart and ipad cart, and these are heavily used by our classes. But, they still do not provide continual, natural access to students. Our school district has invested in infrastructure to enhance wireless access and our staff is being trained in the GAFE environment (Google Apps for Education). We are discovering many apps that provide great support for helping students work on 21st century learning skills. In order to take full advantage of these new learning tools, student access to their own device, which can travel between home and school, provides a tremendous advantage. As well, students have received their own gmail accounts which allow them to store their work on Google Drive and access it from home or school. For devices, we are encouraging parents to consider that a Chromebook-type of device might be most suitable for Gr 1 & 2, with a Chromebook or laptop for Gr 3-6.

We have been fortunate to be able to borrow a Chromebook cart from our Learning Technology Services department and we are finding that our Grade 1 students are using Chromebooks easily and naturally. They are less expensive than laptops and comparable to many tablets (from \$150 - \$350). We have explored the use of tablets and Chromebooks with various grades and are finding that the Chromebook offers the best application to an educational device. There is less student frustration and more student success with this device. Some students have brought an old cellphone to school but these devices are not robust enough for the learning activities we are doing and students are getting frustrated with trying to use them.

Having student-owned devices available allows our teachers to plan to use technology and apps as they make sense, without waiting to book a cart or a time in the computer lab. Using technology will be more seamless and natural, as it is for many adults in the world of work. The lessons taught by our teachers about Digital Citizenship will assist our students to be wise and ethical users of technology as well. We look forward to sharing more information with you about our exciting plans to use technology to enhance student engagement and success in learning!
