
Class Lists for 2017-2018



St. Albert Minor hockey is pleased to offer an Intro to hockey program for 4, 5 & 6 year olds as well as an intro to hockey program for 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 & 12 year olds

Intro to Hockey - There will be two age group programs offered in the 2017 - 2018 Season.

First age group will be <u>4, 5 and 6</u> yr old players as of December 31, 2017 that are new to the sport and just starting out. 4 yr old players <u>must</u> register for Intro to Hockey and are <u>not</u> eligible to register for the Initiation <u>Program</u>.

The second age group will be 7 - 12 years of age as of December 31, 2017 that are new to the sport as well and are looking to try the game of hockey in an organized instructional lead program.

The Intro to Hockey Program will run once weekly (Sundays) for both age groups which will consist of a one hour ice sessions and times will vary. The program delivery will be per the Hockey Canada Group Design. Teams will not be formed for Intro to Hockey this upcoming year. Jersey and socks will be provided. The sessions will be 12 weeks, commencing Sunday November 26th, 2017 ending Sunday March 4th. There will be three weekends with no ice sessions, two at Christmas and the third being the Family day long weekend.


The program will be facilitated by an outside provider that will allow a consistent progression taught approach to the game that will apply to all registered.


